The Churchwardens writes...

# Dear Friends,

As we now go into what is officially called a "Vacancy" we are going to try to answer your most pressing questions. How long will it be before we get another Priest-in-Charge? Probably about a year. The process is this: on Monday 18, November, the Bishop called 6 PCCs to a "pre-vacancy" meeting in White Colne Village Hall. He said the only chance of getting a new incumbent will be one for the 6 Churches, Aldham, Marks Tey, Great and Little Tey, Chappel and Wakes Colne. These 6 churches must get together and write a "Profile" which describes the location, what each church is doing and would like to do and what we would like our next incumbent to be. The Bishop of Colchester says we should have this prepared by mid-March. Then we could advertise in the Church Times or the Diocesan website, or we could ask our patron, CPAS, if they have any clergy looking for incumbencies that match our profile. If we get a short list from that, we interview possibly in May. If not, we continue looking. If an interviewee is offered the job and accepts, then he or she will normally have to give 3 months notice. In the meantime, what happens? We have been greatly blessed by two priests who have each offered to take communion and preach on a monthly basis. Thanks to them and to other clergy and to authorised lay preachers, we have filled every Sunday at Aldham and Marks Tey through to the middle of May 2025. We've got the Bishop of Colchester to come to both Churches on 6 July. Put it in your diary now! For Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals, the Churchwardens should be approached in the first instance and we will contact the Area Dean, Rev Canon Erwin Lammens, Rector of St Mary's Wivenhoe. So we hope you will come and sample a rich offering of services and talks. You will be most welcome and please stay for coffee, tea and biscuits after the service at both churches.

We are approaching an important time in our faith calendar, as we celebrate the birth of our saviour and creator, Jesus Christ. On 22 December, there will be Carol Services in both churches. On Christmas Eve there will be a Crib Service at Marks Tey and later a midnight Communion at Marks Tey and on Christmas Day a Family Service in Aldham Church. We'd love to see you at one or all of these services.

Colchester Early Music regulars Blondel return to St Andrew's Church, Marks Tey on 2nd February with their new programme "Cover story" 2.30-3.30pm with refreshments after the concert, donations to church funds. During the Middle Ages and Renaissance music traveled across Europe, sometimes with the musicians themselves as they journeyed from one employer to another or to the great "minstrel schools" and sometimes in written manuscripts that were copied, gifted and exchanged between musicians and patrons. The melodies themselves often remained intact, with identical versions appearing at opposite ends of the continent. Other tunes underwent a series of adaptions, expansions and cover versions: new words were fitted to old melodies, or new melodies to old words, ornaments and countermelodies were written, dances became songs and songs became dances in a fascinating web of musical connections. Musicians being



musicians there were also a fair few puns and in jokes. In this programme Blondel trace connections between pieces and demonstrate the evolution of some of them on their shawm, baggipe and recorder trios. Includes works by Machaut & Wolkenstein, Bedyngham and Binchois.

The Bridgeway Mission in Colchester, run by Souzan Yousif, has been supporting the Afghan families and single men who have been in the Marks Tey Hotel. Some of the families have been housed but some are still there and so are some single men who are under threat of moving to the Bibby Stockholm barge. The Bridgeway Mission offers support to them by weekly meetings where they can practise their English, help with job applications, work experience, life skills and socialise together. Our band lead the sung worship at St Andrew's Church Marks Tey once or twice a month and some of us also performed a secular set at the Red Lion Manningtree under the name: 'Handbags and Gladrags'. We had a very successful concert in 2023, in aid of the Bridgeway Mission and are having another one this year.
