HIRING OF ST ANDREW'S CHURCH HALL

The church hall at St Andrew's has been redecorated and been fitted with new acoustic boards and new curtains.



It is available to hire during the daytime during the week. It is ideal for any groups who meet regularly or perhaps a Toddler Group who is looking to either start up or looking for new premises.

It is also available most weekends for parties, both children and adults, and general get-togethers.

The size of the hall is $24ft \times 35ft.9ins$ or $7.3m \times 10.9m$ but the height is only 7ft 6ins with a maximum of 16ft or $2.2m \times 4.8m$. There is also another small hall which is $18ft 10ins \times 10ft 8ins$ or $5.75m \times 3.5m$.

The use of Kitchen is included with plenty of crockery & cutlery together with oven, hob & microwave. There are toilets including one disabled toilet. Parking available .Good access for wheelchairs. Good venue for seminars and meetings.

Tables and Chairs for about 70 people. The hire fee for private hire is currently £55 for 3 hours, then £16 per hour after or £8 for 30 minutes. For regular hire charges & to hire the Hall please contact Yvonne Norman 07709064599.
