Church Tower Renovations Update

A golden spire is now clearly visible from the A120. The skilled work of carrying out the repairs on the frame by cutting out defective elements and using block and tackle to lower into place heavy sections with intricate joints should be finished before the end of May.

HIRING OF ST ANDREW'S CHURCH HALL

Now that the church hall at St Andrew's has been redecorated and been fitted with acoustic boards (thanks to Peter Hurcomb), it is available to hire again.

It is available to hire during the daytime during the week. It is ideal for any groups who meet regularly or perhaps a Toddler Group who is looking to either start up or looking for new premises. It is also available most weekends for parties, both children and adults, and general

get-togethers.

The size of the hall is 24ft x 35ft.9ins or 7.3m x 10.9m but the height is only 7ft 6ins with a maximum of 16ft or 2.2m x 4.8m. There is also another small hall which is 18ft 10ins x 10ft 8ins or 5.75m x 3.5m.

The use of Kitchen is included with plenty of crockery & cutlery together with oven, hob & microwave. There are toilets including one disabled toilet. Parking available .Good access for wheelchairs. Good venue for seminars and meetings. Tables and Chairs for about 70

people. The hire fee for private hire is currently £55 for 3 hours, then £16 per hour after or £8 for 30 minutes.

Dear Friends,

It has been decided that to get the timing right in having all the key parties available along with receipt of references the next round of interviews will not be until 1 October. Accordingly the earliest a new Rector would be in post is January 2026.

Christians have just celebrated the feast of Ascension when the risen Jesus was taken up to heaven. Two angels watching beside the disciples told them the same Jesus will come back in the same way. Some of the early believers literally put aspects of their lives on hold. I am pleased to say this is not happening at St Andrew's. There is plenty going on. Many prayers have been answered. We have been blessed with visiting Clergy assisting on Sundays, officiating at funerals and forthcoming marriages.

I have learnt over the years that so often the end result is far better because I waited to get things right.


