

Breaking News What Tey?

Colchester has for many years met or exceeded its housing targets. The Government's demand for a major increase plus the exclusion of the development of Middlewick has resulted in the draft Local Plan's allocation for 1500 around Marks Tey Hall and a further 1000 to the North of the A120. That's a planned 2,500 new houses.

Even over the suggested 15 years this is quite a bombshell and will more than triple the population. But there could be even more housing as developers will be pushing for their sites to be included. Ratification of a Local Plan is a long process and will include consultations and a Planning enquiry. During this process the Parish Council will need full support from residents in the press for the long promised road improvements and better services. Currently there are

Dear Friends,

When I was growing up one of the sayings my mother passed on was 'If a job is worth doing it is worth doing well'.

When our daughter was preparing for her GCSE's I said 'if I know you have done your best I will not moan at your results'. Nearly half of England's Grade 1 listed buildings are Churches. Many of them like 900 year old St. Andrew's were built in small rural villages by men with little or no education. Years ago I realised that one should never underestimate the skills of the medieval craftsmen. In a number of Churches there is a sign saying 'Built to the Glory of God'. As more of the tower structure is exposed the skills of the men who built our village church becomes clearer and admiration grows for the durability of their work.

Everyone doing work or service on God's part should always undertake it to the best of their ability responding to God's love for them. Likewise any parent will do their best for their child. Actually doing one's best in any service to others is an act of respect and leaves a beneficial legacy.

In the last few weeks quality work has been undertaken in creating the profile that will be used to attract a new rector. St.Andrew's Church of England Primary Academy

One of the highlights of this half term has to be the spotlight that has been placed onto music at St Andrew's.

Mrs Shirt, our reception class teacher and music lead, has organised for children in Juniper class to have lessons in playing the toot (a step up from a recorder and the step before the flute). She also set-up a 48 child choir who took part in 'The Big Sing' which was held at The Stanway School - a wonderful opportunity for these children.

On 7th February we took part in the NSPCC Numbers Day. This was a day dedicated to all things maths and the children took part in a range of activities in their own classroom as well as a whole school scavenger hunt. As part of this day children in Juniper (Year 4 and 5) and Sycamore (Year 5 and 6) had a visit from Dr Litterick (a senior maths lecturer from Essex University). This was a wonderful opportunity for our older children to see and hear what maths looks like beyond primary school and to take part in some great activities. Teaching the children to stay safe online is part of the curriculum in every year group at St Andrew's but we also took part in the National Safer Internet Day on 11th February. Later this term we are very much looking forward to World Book Day and Science Week - both of which are sure to be popular and engaging events.

Finally, I would like to inform you that thanks to ATH training, we have managed to obtain and install an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) on our site. It is also being set up on the Circuit website to allow members of the public to be able to use it. The times it is available to members of the public is:

Two are housed in former public telephone boxes; one by the bus stop at Poplar Nurseries and one at the parade of shops on London Road and the latest one is at the Parish Hall outside the main entrance.

There is an annual cost to have them professionally maintained and there are collection boxes at various local businesses to enable local residents to contribute to this cost so please pop some loose change in when you shop locally.
