Dear Friends,

We are in the season of celebrating the harvest. Some may ask is this still relevant? Currently a surprisingly small percentage of people are involved directly or indirectly in Agriculture. Whereas a look at the 1939 register survey shows that the majority of men in what was a rural village were so employed. Further back school log books reveal children kept from school, before it was compulsory, to work in the fields.

My answer is a resounding yes.

Firstly food is the most basic need of life. We owe a big thank you to our farmers, often unappreciated, who face so many uncertainties with the weather which affects yields, from diseases to livestock or crops, and uncertain prices. For those with livestock it is literally 365 days a year, often long hours and in all weathers.

Secondly, it reminds us of the bountiful nature of the earth and the importance of caring for it.

Thirdly a recognition and appreciation of the blessings we have received. In the Old Testament of the Bible we read that the Jews had several celebrations of God's provision including the receipt of Manna in the desert in the exodus story from Egypt and for the first wheat Harvest.

Also a Harvest Festival encourages us to celebrate the principle of sharing, expressing generosity and practising kindness to those in need. Many Churches and Schools accordingly take in donations for their local Foodbanks.

Aldham Church's Harvest Festival is on 5th October and donations can be brought to the service or left in the church.

The church hall at St Andrew's has been redecorated and been fitted with new acoustic boards.

It is available to hire during the daytime during the week. It is ideal for any groups who meet regularly or perhaps a Toddler Group who is looking to either start up or looking for new premises.



It is also available most weekends for parties, both children and adults, and general get-togethers.

The size of the hall is 24ft x 35ft.9ins or 7.3m x 10.9m but the height is only 7ft 6ins with a maximum of 16ft or 2.2m x 4.8m. There is also another small hall which is 18ft 10ins x 10ft 8ins or 5.75m x 3.5m. The use of Kitchen is included with plenty of crockery & cutlery together with oven, hob & microwave. There are toilets including one disabled.
