New Year Resolutions

Did you make any? Are you still keeping them? The pundits tell us that many New Year Resolutions have already faded or are struggling by February.

What drives us to make them? Often it is tradition. Also the New Year feels like a new start with the evenings suddenly stretching out and the promise of spring. However many resolutions are driven by guilt or by trying to rebalance the effects of over eating, over drinking or over spending at the seasonal period.

Some resolutions are simply too ambitious. If yours is to run a half marathon for charity I would not expect you to run 13 miles in Week 1. You would need to build up gradually for it. You might well hit setbacks from having a heavy cold or muscle strains meaning you would miss a number of running opportunities. You might be obliged to rebuild your progress.

I generally don't make New Year Resolutions but I have started several new things in January. In 1985, when the late Peter Adams was Rector, I accepted the challenge to buy a book setting out different Bible passages to be read each day so that in a year I would read the whole Bible. I still read a passage from the Bible everyday, currently along with study notes relating to it.

Engaging in new activities, such as walking more or volunteering, is not confined to early January. So if your head, heart or inner spirit is nudging or challenging you to do something new that is beneficial to you and/or a blessing to others, listen. Consider the commitment required, the benefits and if you are a Christian pray over it. May you be enriched and blessed from your new path.

It is wonderful to be back in school after the Christmas break and classes have started the new year focused, engaged and calm.

Each class has started new learning across the curriculum and I have thoroughly enjoyed seeing this in action and being part of this in class. In the first week alone our Oak Class children were writing about 'The Naughty Bus' as well as looking at the 'Part - Whole' model for numbers to 5. In Maple Class, the children started a new unit on Materials and were writing about Jack and the Beanstalk. In Chestnut Class, the children made their own Igneous rocks using food to replicate and understand how these types of rocks are formed. In Juniper Class, the children started their close reading exploring the story of Pandora's box as well as learning about how to measure the volume of shapes. Finally, in Sycamore class the children have explored the property of shapes, learnt about the basic function of the heart and the circulatory system as well as begun to look forward to their weekly music sessions where they will be learning to play the 'Toot'.

Parents and Carers are being invited into school to engage in two workshops this half term which focus on Phonics and Early Reading for Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3. These workshops aim to give parents and carers a better insight into how this element of the curriculum is taught in school, and to offer ways in which to support their children at home.

This term in school we are also looking forward to many additional events alongside our curriculum learning. These include World Book Day, Numbers Day, Safer Internet Day, Juniper and Maple class trips and a Chestnut Class Easter Performance!
