Church Tower Renovation Update

The building works are now well underway behind the sheeting. The spire has been stripped of the shingles, sections of the boards beneath have been removed so some modest repairs could be made. The overall condition of this spire was better than expected due to the extent of previous work. The belfry section has been stripped and the timbers cleaned. For the first time in centuries one can fully see and appreciate the structure. More elements have been replaced in the past than I had appreciated. All the professionals have been amazed at how such large heavy timbers could have been put together 30 foot off the ground more than 500 years ago.

Mainly on the lower stage there are significant areas of decay and weakening to the timber frame where moisture has got in and major difficult repairs are being made by skilful carpenters. Andrew Waters.

St. Andrew's Church Marks Tey Parish News Iain MacCallum Churchwarden for Aldham writes...

Dear Friends,

What I wanted to talk about was a chance remark a visitor from Friends of Essex Churches made when he asked about our progress with the search for a new Priest-in-Charge of the six churches. I told him we now had the proof copy of the advertisement that will appear in the next issue of the Church Times. He nearly fell off his chair! His church had been in Vacancy for 18 months before they had got this far!

Our Vacancy began on 27th October 2024 when there was a farewell to Ian and Jane at Chappel Village Hall. The search for a new incumbent was outlined in the December/January Newsletter. Since then, two members of each of the six churches were appointed to produce the Profile, a document that describes the churches and the kind of person we would like to have as our next Priest-in-Charge. Emma Hopkins has collated all contributions. The Profile is on the Diocese of Chelmsford website. In anticipation of the interviews, a group of 8 selectors have been appointed, two from each PCC. These are Andrew Waters and Emma Hopkins for Marks Tey, and Coral Wingate and Iain MacCallum for Aldham.

Since the last inter-regnum in 2009, diocesan procedures have changed and the Archdeacon now takes a more prominent role. Our Archdeacon, Ruth Patten, is only now emerging from a long illness (please pray for her) and the Archdeacon of Stansted, Kate Peacock, is leading the process. With input from the 12, she has formulated the Advertisement, a copy of which may also be found on the Diocesan website.
