Church Tower Appeal

We now know the cost of the repair project, the contractor we hope to instruct - Punch Construction of Inworth and the amount of additional money we need to raise - £130000. Several applications for Grants have already been submitted and more applications are planned. If our fund raising goes to plan work will commence in the summer. The 900 year old Grade I listed building with its unusual and very distinctive tower is treasured for its beauty, its setting, being a familiar sight leaving for or returning home from London on the train, its depiction of Marks Tey, being the connection to the village's ancient past and to the future. Whilst for many others it is where they attended Sunday School, where they or their parents were married, where loved ones are buried, was part of their faith journey or where they first came to faith. Any financial support you feel able to make will be much appreciated, will help us to reach our target and will demonstrate to Trust Funds that the Church is valued by the Community.

Have you seen "Mr Bates vs The Post Office"? It's a brilliant drama and all the reports in the news since then have only confirmed the story. I've found myself thinking about it ever since, as have a lot of us, judging from the ongoing reports and investigations.

How was it possible to believe that all these sub-postmasters were thieves and criminals and the computers were faultless, bug-free? "You're the only one, nobody else has had a problem." "Nobody can access Horizon remotely, it has to be your transactions." So many statements that have since proved false, but nobody willing to accept responsibility. Protecting the Post Office's reputation, rather than admit to problems with Horizon. Compensation that has still to be paid years later, while some victims have since died. A tragedy at every point. Church of England accused, for ordaining Paula Vennells and then recommending her to be a Bishop!

Colchester Early Music

Medieval & Renaissance concert in St Andrew's Church

Our winter 2023/24 season continues with two more concerts coming up, both at 2.30pm for one hour in St Andrew's Church. The November and December concerts were very well received, and the February concert is at a special low price so if you've not been before perhaps this is your chance to give it a try. Performances are fairly informal with lively chat between the music to explain some of the background and instruments and tea, coffee and biscuits served afterwards (donations to the church welcome please for these). Concession price tickets are available to anyone who asks for them, on a pay as you feel basis, and under 16s get in free when accompanied by a paying adult.

4th February: Consort of 1 - Playing Playford

Consort of 1 is a project by local resident and oragniser of the Colchester Early Music concert series Lizzie Gutteridge, using modern live-looping equipment (as used by the likes of Ed Sheeran) to make new arrangements of ancient music. This performance will feature dance tunes, catches (rounds) and divisions from 17thc London's famous music publisher: John Playford. Instruments will include violin, recorders, bagpipes, pipe and tabor and curtal (early bassoon).

17th March: The New Cambridge Waits

Waits were groups of official musicians who worked in cities and towns from medieval times to the 18th Century. They would play for the Mayor and civic occasions, but could also knock out some popular music for the people. Band members Terry Mann (chief Wait, composer and instrument maker), Emma Mordue (minstrel, sprite, juggler and all-round Tudor entertainer) and Lizzie Gutteridge (see above) will bring you a selection of their favourites Medieval and Tudor tunes on shawms, recorders, bagpipes and crumhorns.
